To Dr. Constantine Papadakis, of Blessed Memory, Preeminent Educator and Distinguished Member of Leadership 100

Dr. Constantine Papadakis raised the endowment, enrollment and profile of Drexel University during his tenure as President of that institution. Taki will be awarded the Archbishop Iakovos Leadership 100 Award for Excellence, posthumously, in a special tribute at the Grand Banquet, Saturday evening. His wife and daughter, Eliana and Maria, will accept on his behalf. Taki was a distinguished member of Leadership 100, who lived daily his Orthodox faith and bequeathed to all the best of Hellenic ideals.

University, he was familiarly called "Taki" by students and friends alike and was known for his smiling, gregarious personality. His reputation was extended beyond the school he so loved, to the nation and to the world, and he was honored for his contributions in advancing education. His legacy of promoting Hellenic

ideals will live on in Leadership 100, in the Greek American Community and will no doubt continue to influence the lives of many of our young people and of our society. To him, education was the most important gift we could give our children and he encouraged our youth to be diligent in their studies and to strive for perfection.

An innovator in higher education with extensive experience in both academe and the corporate world, he was President of Drexel from 1995 to 2009. He had used the historic strengths of the University (cooperative education, Drexel's focus on technology and the rich resources of its Philadelphia location) to increase full-time undergraduate enrollment from 4,500 in 1996 to more than 11,000 today. Drexel now educates a headcount of 21,000 students, is the sixth-largest employer in Philadelphia, employing 8,100 people, and has an annual budget of more than \$650 million. Under his leadership, the school acquired schools of

As President of the medicine, nursing and public health, and in private Philadelphia 2006 started its own law school. Papadakis University, he was also oversaw the construction of numerous familiarly called "Taki" buildings on campus.

> Before coming to Drexel, Papadakis was the dean of engineering at the University of Cincinnati. He received his undergraduate degree in civil engineering from the National Technical University in Greece. He held a master's degree in civil engineering from the University of Cincinnati and a Ph.D. from the University of Michigan.

> Papadakis also once headed the civil engineering department at Colorado State University and was vice president of Tetra Tech Inc., a Honeywell subsidiary, before joining Cincinnati. Dr. Papadakis joined Bechtel Power Company in 1974, where he served in several engineering positions. He was author or co-author of 80 articles and technical publications.

> Papadakis served as a member of the Business Higher Education Forum and the Council on Competitiveness. He also served on the board of directors of the National Commission for Cooperative Education and the World Trade Center of Greater Philadelphia. He was a member of the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce Executive Committee, the Board of Directors of the Opera Company of Philadelphia, the Hellenic College/Holy Cross Board of Trustees, and the Judicial Council of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania. The recipient of numerous awards and honors here and abroad, he was inducted into the Order of St. Andrew the Apostle as Archon of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople.

Peter Diamandis, Space Pioneer

Dr. Peter Diamandis, who will address the Grand Banquet on Saturday, February 26, 2011, will be presented with the Archbishop Iakovos Leadership 100 Award for Excellence for his contributions to science, our national life and Hellenic ideals. A pioneer in the commercial space industry, he is the Chairman and CEO of the X PRIZE Foundation, which leads the world in designing and launching large incentive prizes to drive radical breakthroughs for the benefit of humanity. Best known for the \$10 million Ansari X PRIZE for private spaceflight and the \$10 million Progressive Automotive X PRIZE for 100 mile-pergallon equivalent cars, the Foundation is now launching prizes in Exploration, Life Sciences, Energy, and Education.

Diamandis is also an international leader in the commercial space arena, having founded and run many of the leading entrepreneurial companies in this sector including Zero Gravity Corporation, the Rocket Racing League and Space Adventures.

As co-Founder & Chairman of the Singularity University, a Silicon Valley based institution partnered with NASA, Google, Autodesk and Nokia, Diamandis counsels the world's top enterprises on how to utilize exponential technologies and incentivized innovation to dramatically accelerate their business objectives.

He also co-founded the International Space University in Strasbourg, France where he served as its first Managing Director and today serves as a Trustee.

Diamandis is the winner of the 2006 Heinlein Award, the 2006 Lindberg Award, the 2006 Wired RAVE Award, the Konstantine Tsiolkovsky Award and twice the winner of the Aviation and Space technology Laurel.

Diamandis attended MIT where he received his degrees in molecular genetics and aerospace engineering, as well as Harvard Medical School where he received his M.D.

Diamandis' stated mission is "to open the space frontier for humanity." In a recent article in the Wall Street Journal he observed that the "fundamental realities" that will drive space exploration are private capital rather than government agencies, which now see space as a good investment, and companies and investors who now realize that "metals, minerals, energy and real estate" are in "near-infinite quantities in space."

Ted Leonsis, Business Entrepreneur



Ted Leonsis, one of the country's premier business entrepreneurs and a member of Leadership 100, who will address the Business Forum, Friday, February 25, 2011, will be presented with the Archbishop Iakovos Leadership 100 Award for Excellence for his contributions to the economy, our national life and Hellenic ideals. He is the founder, chairman and majority owner of Monumental Sports & Entertainment, which comprises three professional sports teams - the Washington Capitals (NHL), the Washington Wizards (NBA) and the Washington Mystics (WNBA) -, as well as Verizon Center and the Baltimore-Washington Ticketmaster franchise. The

company also operates Kettler Capitals Iceplex (the Capitals' training facility and front office) and George Mason University's Patriot Center.

Leonsis retired from active management of AOL in 2006, where during the previous 13 years he held a number of senior positions, including vice chairman and president. He retains the position of vice chairman emeritus. At a May 2010 ceremony celebrating AOL's 25th anniversary, one of the buildings on AOL's Virginia campus was renamed the Leonsis Creative Center in his honor.

Recently Leonsis was chairman of Revolution Money, which provides secure payments through an Internet-based platform and in 2009 was sold to American Express; Leonsis is now on the Board of Directors at American Express. He is currently chairman of Clearspring Technologies, the largest online content sharing network, which connects publishers, services and advertisers to audiences on the social web. Over the past 20 years he has been a board member or early investor in a number of successful technology companies, from Google to Groupon.

In 2008, Leonsis founded SnagFilms, which enables online audiences to find, watch, share and support thousands of documentary films. SnagFilms grew out of Leonsis' experience as a producer of such award-winning documentary films as *Nanking* and *Kicking It. Nanking* premiered at the 2007 Sundance Film Festival, where it was awarded the Documentary Editing Award and has won a Peabody Award and an Emmy Award. *Kicking It* premiered at the 2008 Sundance Film Festival and aired on ESPN. A third documentary produced by Leonsis, *A Fighting Chance*, was aired on ESPN in the Fall of 2010. In addition to being the Internet's leading site for watching and sharing nonfiction films, SnagFilms owns indieWIRE, the leading news, information and networking site for independent-minded filmmakers, the industry and moviegoers alike.


While working on documentaries and establishing SnagFilms, Leonsis coined and championed the term "filmanthropy." It is his unique way of combining film and philanthropy, raising the awareness of important issues with the goal of promoting change by increasing volunteerism and activating charitable giving.

Leonsis' book The Business of Happiness: 6 Secrets To Extraordinary Success In Work And Life was published in February 2010 and quickly became a bestseller. Previous books by Leonsis include Blue Magic: The People, Power, and Politics Behind The IBM Personal Computer (1988).

In addition to serving on the Board of Directors of American Express, where he is chairman of the Technology and Innovation Committee, Leonsis sits on the board of publicly held companies such as Nutrisystem and Rosetta Stone. He also serves on the Technology Committee of the Board of Directors for Alcatel-Lucent, and the Board of Directors of his alma mater, Georgetown University. Leonsis has numerous business interests and investments, including the following companies: Algentis, GridPoint, Triporati, Mahalo.com, MediaBank, MobilePosse, ObjectVideo, SB Nation, TidalTV and Zedge.

Leonsis is a committed philanthropist and is actively involved with numerous charities, including Best Buddies, D.C. Central Kitchen, See Forever Foundation, Street Soccer USA, Venture Philanthropy Partners, YouthAIDS and others through the work of the Leonsis Foundation.

John Mckesson Camp II, **Classical Archaeologist**



John McKesson Camp II, a noted archaeologist, will address the Opening Breakfast, Thursday, February 24, 2011. He will be presented with the

Archbishop Iakovos leadership 100 Award for Achievement. A graduate of Harvard University where he studied the Classics, he earned an MA and PhD in Classical Archaeology from Princeton University. He has taught at Princeton, the ASCS in Athens, DePauw University, Lake Forest College, St. John's University, University of Maryland and Randolph-Macon College, where he is currently Stavros Niarchos Foundation Professor of Classics as of 2009.

Dr. Camp has led or participated in excavations at the Athenian Agora, Corinth, Isthmia, Pylos, Epidauros, Naxos, Koilada (underwater), and Athens. He has given papers or lectured at the Metropolitan Museum, National Gallery, Tampa Museum, Brown University, University of California Berkeley, College of New Jersey, Connecticut College, Gettysburg College, Hampden-Sydney College, the Hellenic Center in Washington DC, the Onassis Center at New York University, the University of Pennsylvania, Smith College, University of South Florida, University of Virginia, William and Mary, Hollins College, Lynchburg College and Boston College, Boston University and Bucknell University.

He delivered the Behrakis Lecture at the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, the Devens Lecture at the Chicago Art Institute and spoke at the Getty Museum and at numerous universities, institutes and museums abroad, including the National Museum and Benaki Museum in Athens, the University of Athens, the University of Thessaloniki, the University of Volos, the British Museum, the Albright Institute in Jerusalem, the Academy of World History in Moscow, Edinburgh University, Oxford University and University College Dublin.

Dr. Camp has served on the Advisory Board, American Journal of Archaeology and as an Academic Trustee of the Governing Board of the AIA. His numerous books and publications include: The Athenian Agora, The Athenian Agora Guide, The Birth of Democracy, The Archaeology of Athens, The World of the Ancient Greeks, The Athenian Agora: New Perspectives on an Ancient Site, Gods and Heroes in the Athenian Agora, Ancient Athenian Building Methods, Horses and Horsemanship in the Athenian Agora, The Athenian Agora: a short guide to the excavations, and The Athenian Citizen.

Michael Psilakis, **Executive Chef**



Executive Chef Michael Psilakis will address the Saturday Forum, February 26, 2011. He will be presented with

the Archbishop Iakovos Leadership 100 Award for Achievement. Psilakis has acquired many of the food world's highest honors in the short time he has been on the culinary scene. In 2008 alone, Psilakis was awarded Food & Wine's Best New Chef and Bon Appetit's Chef of the Year distinctions; nominated for A-List Chef by Bravo TV; and had his upscale Greek restaurant, Anthos, nominated for a James Beard Award in the category of Best New Restaurant. He was also named "Chef of the Year" by Esquire Magazine and his restaurant Anthos was awarded a Michelin star and named the third of ten best new restaurants by The New York Times restaurant reviewer, Frank Bruni.

As the eldest first generation son in a traditional Greek family on Long Island, Psilakis was destined to embody the hospitality and appreciation for food so highly valued by his party-loving family. When his father installed an immense BBQ in the backyard, he taught young Michael to roast whole lambs on a spit.

A tremendous cook, the chef's mother taught him everything about the flavors and techniques of classic Greek cooking and remains his greatest influence in the kitchen. "Even today, the flavors of my dishes are my mother's flavors," says Psilakis. "And my instincts for taking Greek cuisine in new directions-these I've inherited from her."

The opening of Onera on Manhattan's Upper West Side allowed Psilakis to realize a longtime dream and return to the cuisine that first ignited his passion for cooking. The unique upscale Greek-inspired cuisine he served at Onera earned him a reputation as a rising culinary star.

Already in the works were plans to bring new additions to the New York dining scene. Psilakis transformed Onera into Kefi, a rustic cozy neighborhood spot serving the Greek food he ate as a child. He moved his upscale Greek cooking from Onera to a larger stage with the opening of Anthos in midtown. Meaning rebirth or blossoming, Anthos features Psilakis' signature Greek cuisine and has also earned numerous accolades. In December 2008, Kefi was relocated to a larger space, tripling the size of the beloved taverna. May 2009 brought a partnership with Kor Hotel Management to open Eos, a striking Mediterranean restaurant at the new Viceroy Miami at the Icon Brickell urban resort enclave on Biscayne Bay.
