

JIM GIANOPULOS

Jim Gianopulos, Chairman & Chief Executive Officer of Twentieth Century Fox Film, overseeing News Corporation's motion picture companies, including Twentieth Century Fox Film Corp., Fox 2000, Fox Searchlight Pictures, Fox Animation Studios, Blue Sky Studios, Fox International Productions, and their related entities, will speak Thursday afternoon, February 7 on "Hollywood and Hellenism". He will be introduced by his pastor, the renowned Fr. John Bakas, Dean of Saint Sophia Cathedral in Los Angeles, who will also speak to conferees.

One of the longest-tenured studio chairmen in the film industry, Gianopulos oversees all feature film production and marketing, as well as global distribution through all windows and platforms spanning the theatrical, broadcast, cable, home entertainment, digital and mobile markets. During his time as Chairman of Fox, the studio has had its most profitable years ever. He has been involved in the evolution of new entertainment media and technologies for more than 25 years, and is considered a leading strategist in the industry. During his tenure at the studio, he has overseen the release of a broad range of successful films, including Life of Pi, the X-Men series, Rise of the Planet of the Apes, Night At The Museum, Taken (and its sequel), The Simpsons Movie, Borat, The Day After Tomorrow, Walk the Line, the Star Wars Trilogy, Live Free or Die Hard, Minority Report, and Moulin Rouge. He also has the unique distinction of having championed two of the biggest gambles, and the two highest grossing films of all time: Avatar and Titanic.


Under his leadership, the studio's animation division, Blue Sky Studios, produced successful films such as the *Ice Age* series, and Fox Searchlight Pictures, the studio's specialized division, produced commercial and critical successes such as *The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel, The Descendants, Black Swan,* and the Oscarwinning *Slumdog Millionaire,* among many others. Prior to his



current post, Gianopulos was Chairman & CEO of Fox Filmed Entertainment and before that, he was President of Twentieth Century Fox International, a position he held since 1994. Among the many notable successes during Gianopulos' tenure at Fox International are the Oscar winners *Titanic* and *Braveheart*, in addition to at one point having four of the five top grossing pictures of all-time internationally: *Titanic, Star Wars, Independence Day* and *Star Wars: Episode 1 – The Phantom Menace*.

The son of Greek immigrants and a native New Yorker, Gianopulos attended the Master's program at the New York University School of Law, the Fordham School of Law, earning a Juris Doctor in 1976 and Boston University, earning a BA in 1973. He resides in Los Angeles with his wife Ann and their three daughters.

ALEXANDER PAYNE



Alexander Payne, who will speak Friday afternoon, February 8 and will be introduced by his former pastor in Omaha, Nebraska, Very Rev. Fr. Eugene N. Pappas, now of Three Hierarchs Church in Brooklyn, New York, is the award-winning screenwriter, film director and producer, known for films like *The Descendants* (2011), *Sideways* (2004), *About Schmidt* (2002), and *Election* (1999).

He was born Constantine Alexander Payne, February 10, 1961 in Omaha, Nebraska, the youngest of three sons of Peggy (née Constantine) and George Payne, restaurant owners, and grew up in the same neighborhood as billionaire Warren Buffett. His grandfather had Anglicized the last name from Papadopoulos. He attended Creighton Preparatory School and Stanford University, where he double-majored in Spanish and History and, as part of the latter program, studied at the University of Salamanca in Spain. Payne earned an MFA in 1990 from the UCLA Film School.

Payne wrote and directed his first full-length film, *Citizen Ruth*, in 1996, followed by the film *Election* in 1999, starring Matthew Broderick and Reese Witherspoon, which won Best Screenplay from the Writers' Guild of America and the New York Film Critics Circle, as well as an Academy Award nomination for Best Adapted Screenplay. He and his writing partner, Jim Taylor, received a Golden Globe in 2003 for the screenplay for

About Schmidt, which premiered in 2002 in competition at the Cannes Film Festival and opened the New York Film Festival, as well as both the Academy Award and Golden Globe in 2005 for Best Adapted Screenplay for the 2004 film Sideways, which Payne directed. The film also won the Golden Globe Award for Best Motion Picture – Musical or Comedy. In total, Sideways received five Academy Award Nominations.

He served as a Producer or Executive Producer on the films *King of California, The Assassination of Richard Nixon, The Savages,* and *Cedar Rapids.* He returned to directing in 2011 after a seven year hiatus with *The Descendants,* starring George Clooney. He also cowrote the screenplay, winning his second Academy Award for Best Adapted Screenplay. The film also received five Academy Award nominations, including Best Picture and Best Director. He also co-wrote the screenplay for Jurassic Park III in 2001.

Payne is on the short list of directors who have final cut rights for their films. From 2005 to 2008, he served as a member of the Board of Governors of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences. In 2012, he was named as a member of the Jury for the Main Competition at the 2012 Cannes Film Festival. He is also on the Board of Directors of an Omaha non-profit cinematheque, Film Streams.

NIA VARDALOS

Nia Vardalos, the Canadian-American actress best known for the 2002 Academy Award–nominated film *My Big Fat Greek Wedding*, will speak on Friday evening, February 8. Born and raised in Winnipeg, Canada, she is an Academy Award nominated screenwriter, actor, director and producer.

Vardalos was drawn to the performing arts early on. After studying theater and music at Toronto's Ryerson University, she followed her natural instincts for comedy and took a job at the box-office of Toronto's Second City theater; the home of comedy's famed SCTV. Soon thereafter, when one of the performers fell ill, Vardalos volunteered herself on-stage as a last minute addition to the cast. Having spent hours studying the show from the back of the theater, Vardalos convinced the producers that she knew the sketches and could step in. Her performance so impressed the producers that she was given a permanent spot in the troupe as a performer and a writer. Vardalos then relocated to Chicago's Second City ensemble where she went on to win Chicago's Jeff Award for Best Actress.

Following her stints at Second City, Vardalos relocated to Los Angeles to pursue television and film work. While making small appearances in sit-coms such as *The Drew Carey Show* and *Two Guys and a Girl*, she began writing a screenplay about her wedding to husband and fellow actor Ian Gomez.

Unable to get the screenplay produced, Vardalos turned the material into a one woman show. As the writer, producer and star of her solo stage show My Big Fat Greek Wedding, Vardalos would find herself embarking on a journey which would eventually bring her worldwide acclaim. With a unique wit and irony, the stage performance of "My Big Fat Greek Wedding" soon began commanding sold-out performances and became a must-see event for Los Angeles' Greek community. It also drew the attention of Hollywood heavyweight-couple Rita Wilson, herself a member of the Greek community, and her husband Tom Hanks. Able to relate to the funny familial interactions which Vardalos portrayed in the show, Wilson and Hanks decided to produce Vardalos' screenplay of My Big Fat Greek Wedding, with Vardalos as the star.

Premiering in 2002, My Big Fat Greek Wedding was an immediate critical and box-office sensation, becoming one of the highest-grossing independent films of all time, and is still the highest grossing romantic comedy of all time. The film garnered Vardalos awards recognition for her writing and acting including an Academy Award nomination for Best Original Screenplay; a Golden Globe nomination for Best Performance by an Actress in a Motion Picture – Comedy or Musical; a Screen Actors Guild nomination for Outstanding Performance by the Cast of a Theatrical Motion Picture; a Broadcast Film Critics Association nomination for Best Writer; and an Independent Spirit Award for Best Debut Performance.



Following the success of My Big Fat Greek Wedding, Vardalos would write, produce and co-star with Toni Collette and David Duchovny in the buddy comedy Connie and Carla and co-star with Richard Dreyfuss in the romantic comedy My Life In Ruins.


She would make her directorial debut in 2009 with the comedy *I Hate Valentine's Day*, which she would write and co-star in with *My Big Fat Greek Wedding* alum John Corbett.

Having become one of Hollywood's most sought after comedic actor/writers Vardalos would go on to co-write the box-office hit Larry Crowne starring Tom Hanks and Julia Roberts, and is currently penning the "anti-romantic comedy" Leftovers, in which she will star and produce for Paramount Pictures. She also continues to make guest star appearances on television series such as Curb Your Enthusiasm, Grey's Anatomy, Cougar Town, and The Good Guys, among others.

This spring will find Vardalos publishing her first book *Instant Mom*, a witty, honest and poignant road-to-parenting story about the circumstances that led to the adoption of her daughter, the daily chaos of parenting, and the inspiration for her becoming a major advocate for adoption. With her signature comedic flair and candor, in *Instant Mom* Vardalos opens up about the heartaches and headaches, tears and laughter that make up what it means to be a parent.

In addition to her extensive writing, producing, and acting career, Vardalos continues to fundraise for the underprivileged, and is a spokesperson for National Adoption Day.

FATHER JOHN BAKAS





St. Sophia Cathedral, Los Angeles, California.

Father John Bakas, the dynamic and renowned Dean of Saint Sophia Cathedral of Los Angeles since 1995, will speak on Thursday afternoon, February 7 on "A Lighthouse on Rocky Shores". He was ordained to the Diaconate on March 7, 1976 and to the Priesthood on January 21, 1979. He has previously served St. George Church, Albuquerque, New Mexico, Annunciation Church, Modesto, CA, St. George Church, Fresno, CA and St. John Church, Las Vegas, NV. He is Co-Founder and First Director of St. Nicholas Ranch Retreat Center, Founder, St. Basil Parish in Modesto, CA and Priest and Spiritual Director of The Virgin Mary Convent, Dunlap, CA.

Father Bakas is Founder of the Diocesan Camp AGAPE, "Kids N' Cancer" program for disadvantaged children with cancer. He has taught at the University of New Mexico and at California State University Stanislaus, and has also served as Chaplain and President of The Valley Children's Hospital Foundation in Fresno, CA. He is the Founder of the Rotary House Children's Hospice in Fresno, CA, Project Nino, Mexico, offering free medical care for poor children in Mexico, Camp Axios for Los Angeles inner-city at risk youth, and the Byzantine-Latino Quarter of Los Angeles-inner city redevelopment program. He

serves as Co-Chairman of the Police-Clergy Forum of the Los Angeles Police Department and as Commissioner of the Los Angeles Commission on Children, Youth and Families. He is currently part-time faculty member at Loyola Marymount University.

His degrees include M.A. Equivalent, Holy Cross Seminary Program, Priest with Lay Profession: M.A. Philosophy, University of New Mexico: and Master of Divinity, Loyola Marymount University. He has served as a consultant on Steven Spielberg's *Prince of Egypt*, and on Mel Gibson's *The Passion of Christ* and as on-air commentator for the A&E production of *Christianity, The First Thousand Years*, and *Banned from the Bible*.

Father Bakas emigrated with his family from Greece in 1958, settling in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He worked as an administrator at the University of New Mexico, taught in the Latin American Affairs Department and served as Assistant Dean of Admissions. He was a tenor for the Albuquerque Light Opera. He is married to Presvytera Maria and has four adult children, three daughters and a son.


MICHAEL S. JOHNSON

Michael S. Johnson, a member of the Leadership 100 Board of Trustees, will speak at the opening of the Conference on Thursday morning, February 7, on "Oil in the World's Economy and the Discovery of Parshall Field, North Dakota, the Largest Oil Field in North America". He is a pioneering petroleum geologist recognized for his contribution to the discovery of Parshall Field.

Born in 1926 in Maryville, Missouri of Greek immigrant parents, his interest in the oil business began when his family moved to Tulsa, Oklahoma in 1931, then called the oil capital of the U.S. He graduated from The Ohio State University with a B.Sc. degree in 1947 and an M.S. degree in 1949, both in geology.

Starting in 1949, he has spent his entire 61 year career in the Rocky Mountain Region. He spent his first nine years with Amerada Petroleum Corporation, attaining the position of district geologist for the Wyoming District in Casper, Wyoming. In 1958, he left Amerada to become Rocky Mountain Exploration Manager for Apache Oil Corporation in Denver, Colorado. In 1963, he left Apache to begin his career as an independent consulting petroleum geologist and for the past 47 years he has resided in Denver, concentrating his exploration efforts in the Williston Basin, a geologic structural basin in eastern Montana, western North and South Dakota, and southern Saskatchewan, Canada, renowned for its major oil and gas fields.

Johnson has been a member of The American Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG) for more than 60 years and has been involved in more than 15 oil field discoveries in North

Dakota, Montana, Colorado, Wyoming and Kansas. His greatest achievement, however, was the discovery of Parshall Field in North Dakota. Today, Parshall is the largest oil field, in size, in North America, and extends over four million acres with producible reserves of some ten billion barrels.

In 2009, for his contributions to the Parshall discovery, he received the Outstanding Explorer of the Year Award from The American Association of Petroleum Geologists (AAPG) and also from The Rocky Mountain Association of Geologists. He is also a member of the Wyoming Geological Association, the Society of Independent Professional Earth Scientists, and a Senior Fellow and member of the Geological Society of America. The Michael S. Johnson named Grant is awarded annually to a graduate student at the Ohio State University through the AAPG Foundation Grants in Aid program.

Johnson was a member of the Archdiocesan Council from 1974 to 1996. He became an Archon of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, The Order of St. Andrew the Apostle in 1979. He is also a member of FAITH: An Endowment for Orthodoxy and Hellenism. Johnson's wife, Katherine, is also a member of Leadership 100. They have two adult children.

MARY J. MITCHELL



Mary J. Mitchell, who will speak at a special program on Saturday, February 9, on "Drawn to Fashion", is acknowledged for her 30-year career as a fashion illustrator for top designers and major department stores. Born Mary Kafasis to Greek immigrant parents in Buffalo, N.Y. Mary Mitchell first showed a penchant for art starting in high school, where her talents were nurtured by the mentorship of her art teacher and encouraged by early success in national art competitions. An unexpected bequest from her late mother made it possible for her to attend the Albright Art School, affiliated with the University of Buffalo, from which she graduated with a degree in fashion illustration before launching her career as a professional fashion illustrator with the Flint & Kent department store in Buffalo.

After she met Kearney, Nebraska native and Georgetown Law School graduate John Mitchell, a long-distance courtship ensued and the couple married in 1951, settling in Kearney. Mary took classes at Kearney State Teachers College, now the University of Nebraska at Kearney, and this association led to her teaching courses in the college's art department.

In 1968 the Mitchells moved to Omaha and Mary returned to fashion illustration full time, working for the Nebraska Clothing Co. for what she described as "four fabulous years." After striking

out on her own as a freelance illustrator, she continued to refine her fashion illustration skills with clients including Topp's, Goldstein Chapman, Herzberg's, Zoob's, Parsow's and Wolf Brothers. Her career flourished during a period when fashion illustration's role was critical to successful commerce in everything from haute couture to ready-to-wear, and when Omaha's fashion merchants helped to define the meaning of style in the heartland.

In the 1960s and '70s, pages of the fashion press were filled with drawn images that captured the energy of the industry at its peak. That period of dynamic social and cultural change affected fashion but was in turn affected by it. This is one of the critical dimensions of fashion in general: it is inseparable from the age that spawns it, and it serves inevitably as a barometer of that age's tendencies and unique character.

The Department of Textiles, Merchandising and Fashion Design of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln recently announced the dedication of the Mary Mitchell Fashion Studio in conjunction with the exhibition "Drawn to Fashion: The Illustrations of Mary Mitchell" which took place October 22 to November 30, 2012 at the Robert Hillestad Textiles Gallery on the second floor of the Home Economics Building.

LEXY AND STEPHANY PRODROMOS



Lexy Prodromos

Lexy and Stephany Prodromos are third generation Greek American sisters from the Chicago area who are devoted to their Greek heritage, and who have translated into English and performed in Greek and English popular Greek songs from the 1960s, 70s and 80s by Manos Hadzidakis and Niko Ignatiadis. Their YouTube videos have more than 250,000 views and they have been featured on Fox, NBC and WGN television. Their remake of "Eye of The Tiger", written specifically for them by the song's composer, was popular on radio in the UK. Both also perform classical music.

Their goal is to show young Greek Americans that modern Greece, not just Ancient Greece, has produced top flight cultural achievements. They make their CD available, free of charge, to the various Greek organizations that send young Greek Americans to Greece so that they can put them on their iPods and immerse themselves in the Greek language and Modern Greek culture. They hope that the English language versions of these songs will help non-Greeks appreciate them. They also sing extensively for charity.



Lexy is a freshman economics major and music minor at Pepperdine University in Los Angeles, where she was offered a voice scholarship. She won the award as outstanding vocalist at New Trier High School in Winnetka, Illinois, itself a recent winner of a Grammy as best high school music program in the country. She has won numerous voice competitions in the Midwest. A former two star nationally ranked junior tennis player, she is also one of the lead players on Pepperdine's club tennis team.

Stephany is a sophomore at New Trier High School. She has also already won several high school voice competitions. Formerly ranked as high as second in the Chicago district by the US Tennis Association, she has been a two-star player nationally.
